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Over the last few months you may have noticed lots of political voice in the education space. Some of this can be very confusing for those of us who are educationalists, let alone parents of children attending school, so I want to send some reassurances your way about some of the topics you may have heard about.

Structured Literacy

Firstly, I'd like to say that structured literacy is not new and that for many years Upokongaro School has delivered elements of it. What is new is that we now have access to funding to get our teachers training in some specific programmes that the government would like delivered. Better Start Literacy Approach is the programme that we have looked into and chosen for the Upokongaro School Year 0-3 students. Mrs Topia has been selected as our facilitator and is working with the junior teaching staff to deliver BSLA. Very soon the team will hold an information evening where whānau can come and be informed about it. Programmes for Year 4-8 will come in time and we'll keep you up to date with what to expect then.

Assessment

You may also have heard the announcement about the Minister of Educations intention to "develop a consistent, coherent system of assessment and aromatawai - one that is used throughout students' school years." This has many benefits for students, and for educators across education, however I would like to make it very clear that Upokongaro School has always had a consistent and coherent approach to assessment throughout the school. Over time we have moderated and critically discussed our approaches to assessment to ensure improvement and best practice for our students. Assessment, like structured literacy, is not new to us and the tools that are being proposed are either already being used by us or we have an equivalent to them. Please rest assured that these practices are our everyday norm.

Math

Whilst I am still waiting for the details of the structured math programme that will be available for delivery in Term One of next year, I again want to assure you that math at Upokongaro School is trucking along fine. As a coincidence of an inquiry I started into math last year, we started a structured approach to math this year called Math No Problem. It is an approach we started as a two year trial and my greatest hope is that this is one of the programmes that the government will make available. Watch this space!

Your children are doing well at school and there is lots to celebrate at Upokongaro School. The events and opportunities that students are participating in all help to ensure they learn by accessing a variety of experiences across the curriculum. Soon we will have completed the construction of our swing and sandpit and the area surrounding it ready for opening. This is part one of a larger project to add variety and engagement with our environment. With that said, I'd like to thank all the parents, friends of the school, and businesses that have helped us to make this happen, we are deeply grateful for your service and contributions.
